

Be Crowned Wentworth Park Dartball Champion

Terms & Conditions

Wentworth Park Greyhounds

Operated by the NSW Greyhound Breeders, Owners and Trainers Association

1. The Wentworth Park Dartball Champion competition will be conducted on Saturday 14th July 2018 at Wentworth Park Greyhounds, Wentworth Park Road, Glebe NSW 2037. This will be a stand-alone event.
2. There will be two competitions available for entry on the evening.
 - (i) One (1) competition for persons aged 12 and under ("Childs competition");
 - (ii) One (1) competition for persons aged 12 years or above ("All age competition").
3. All persons aged 18 years and under must have parental consent to enter the competition. Please note that children aged 18 years and under must be accompanied by a paying adult when entering Wentworth Park greyhounds.
4. All persons entering Wentworth Park on Saturday 14th July 2018 will be eligible for entry into the Dart Ball Challenge.
5. Patrons wishing to enter the competition will be required to fill in their details on the register at the Dart Ball Competition area at the Southern end of the Grandstand. Competition entry details will include entrant's Date of Birth.
6. Entry details must be completed in full to be eligible, including the patron's signature releasing the NSW GBOTA, Wentworth Park Sporting Complex from any action following the event. Entry for children under the age of 18 must have been signed by a parent or guardian.
7. In addition, contestants will be asked to contribute a gold coin donation for entry. Donations will be collected by the NSW GBOTA, and the total collected will be donated in full to a nominated charity.
8. A contestant may enter on more than one occasion. Each new entry will require a gold coin donation. A maximum of three (3) entries will be allowed over the course of the night per contestant.
9. Entries will be taken on a first come, first served basis. Contestants will be required to line up in an orderly fashion as directed by NSW GBOTA staff.
10. Each contestant will be given three shots using the nominated soccer ball from the marked shot line. The total of each shot will be added together to become the contestant's total score.
11. Should a shot not successfully hit the dart ball board, the shot will be scored as zero.
12. Should a shot land equally on a line, the average of the two scores will be scored.

13. Following the completion of the three shots, the contestants name, and total shot score will be recorded onto the score board tally.
14. The NSW GBOTA official present will be responsible for all scoring decisions and no discussion will be entered into regarding decisions.
15. Contestants will be required to comply with directives issued by NSW GBOTA Staff. Contestants will be briefed at this point to the running of the competition and OH&S guidelines.
16. Contestants must have appropriate footwear to compete, no person shall be allowed to compete in bare feet, open shoes or high heels.
17. The "Child's competition" (Under 12's) will conclude at the end of Race 5 (9.00pm).
18. The contestant with the highest score in the "Child's competition" (Under 12's) at the conclusion of the competition will win \$500.
19. The "All age competition" will conclude at the end of Race 9 (10.20pm).
20. The contestant with the highest score in the "All age competition" at the conclusion of the competition will win \$500.
21. Winning contestants will be required to fill in a payment declaration form to claim winning monies. Note that winning contestants under the age of 18 will require parental consent to claim their prize.
22. Contestants participating do so at their own risk, and in entering the competition, release all parties involved in the promotion of the event.
23. Decisions made by officials of the competition are final, no discussion will be entered into regarding decisions.
